


# EUROPEAN REALITIES Realism Movements of the 1920s and 1930s in Europe

Three hundred works from twenty-one countries form a European panorama of the many facets of realism in art that were ubiquitous in Europe during the 1920s and 1930s. They tell of poverty and misery, economic upheaval, artistic flourishing and progress, urban culture, nightlife, emancipation and diversity.

A devastating world war, the Spanish flu, poverty, a global economic crisis, National Socialism – such were the 1920s. No other epoch has as many parallels to the present day as the period between the two world wars. This richly illustrated volume brings together treasures from across Europe, offering fresh inspiration through superb works of art that remain strikingly relevant. The eclectic period known as the Golden Twenties promises to be a magnet for visitors in Chemnitz, the European Capital of Culture in 2025.

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
# Highlights and breathtaking new works by one of the most influential artists of our time

### ANSELM KIEFER Becoming the Ocean

Since the late 1960s, Anselm Kiefer has explored the profound depths of human history through his work. For his first American retrospective in twenty years, he takes the river as a metaphor for the flux of life and passage of time. Breathtaking new landscapes join iconic works to celebrate the achievements of his nearly sixty-year career.

Becoming the Ocean explores Kiefer's remarkable body of work. From his early evocative landscapes of postwar Europe to his later, monumental canvases on themes of destruction and regeneration, Kiefer's oeuvre challenges our understanding of history and memory. Catalogue highlights include previously unpublished artist writings, lavish illustrations and contributions by writers who inspired Kiefer's famously literary art.



### A universe of colour – between Action Painting and Colour Field Painting

### HELEN FRANKENTHALER Move and Make

Helen Frankenthaler's (1928–2011) radical approach to paint and material creates images pulsating with colour. During the postwar period in the United States, she was a leading figure in abstract art. This volume brings together nearly fifty works, providing a comprehensive overview of the world's largest private collection of Helen Frankenthaler's works – on display at the recently opened Museum Reinhard Ernst in Wiesbaden.

In Frankenthaler's works, paint and canvas become one. The soak-stain technique she developed allows the paint to seep directly into unprimed fabric. The result is a pictorial effect like no other: colour spaces open up, flowing into one another, sometimes saturated, sometimes transparent. Above all, the pictures show an artist willing to take risks: by setting no limits to her artistic work, Frankenthaler was able to create liberated, large-scale paintings full of radiance. Her groundbreaking body of work remains highly relevant today.






Shockingly creative! How Damien Hirst develops groundbreaking work

### DAMIEN HIRST Drawings

A tiger shark in formaldehyde. A diamond-encrusted skull. Damien Hirst is one of the most important contemporary artists and a legend in the Young British Artist movement of the 1990s. He planned his iconic paintings, sculptures and installations through drawings and sketchbooks, and these can now be seen in a museum exhibition for the first time.

The publication provides an opportunity to glance over the shoulder of a great contemporary artist engrossed in his creative process: since the early 1980s, Damien Hirst has used drawings and sketches to plan his celebrated works. He has also created drawings to accompany his paintings and sculptures, to help visualise their core ideas. Among his designs are a drawing machine and the graphic work of fictitious old masters. In this superbly produced new volume, which retains the character of a sketchbook, a star artist reveals a new aspect to his oeuvre.



### HUMAN MARKS Tattooing in Contemporary Art

Human Marks: Tattooing in Contemporary Art explores convergences between tattoo culture and global contemporary art. Presenting fifteen artists who also tattoo, the lavishly illustrated publication unpacks how the ethics, strategies and concerns of tattooing shape the artists' studio practices in experimental and revelatory ways.

The oldest profession meets the latest artistic creations: With essays, artist profiles and interviews, Human Marks presents the full creative spectrum of artists who maintain both tattoo and studio practices to ask what the world of fine art can learn from today's tattoo community. With a range of surprising media – from paintings made with human blood to wearable works in silicone and even perfumery – themes of ritual, ethics and identity tie together the materially dynamic, unexpected and challenging artwork featured in Human Marks.

Carrie Cushman is the Edith Dale Monson Gallery Director at the Hartford Art School Galleries, University of Hartford, Connecticut. She is a curator and educator with a PhD in art history from Columbia University who specialises in the histories of photography and contemporary art from Japan.



### MIGUEL CHEVALIER Digital by Nature

Miguel Chevalier (b. 1959) is one of the pioneers of virtual and digital art. For his multifaceted work he uses the latest technologies, including the newest developments in artificial intelligence (AI), while always keeping up a dialogue with art and cultural history.

Since the 1980s Chevalier has been exploring the possibilities of the computer as a creative means of expression. This richly illustrated volume presents his sculptures and drawings, which he produced by using 3D printing and robotics and videos as well as expansive installations. The book is dedicated to the relationship between the digital and analogue worlds and astonishing connections between nature and technology, as well as human intervention in the environment.



### QUEER MODERNISM 1900-1950


Desire, eroticism, playing with gender – these qualities in the works of queer artists are not regarded here as external to the creative process, but rather as foundational. By approaching the art through a perspective of queer aesthetics, the aim is to discover the visual worlds of hitherto little-known figures of international modernism, from Eastern and Western Europe and from North and South America.

Experimenting with alternative lifestyles is reflected in new visual languages, perspectives and a different aesthetic. "Modern utopias of abolishing the gender binary," "Queer avant-gardes" and "The potential in queer readings of abstraction" are only some of the compelling topics presented in this volume, which also recounts the history of queer lives during war, persecution and resistance.





# Dazzling designs and the multifaceted fashion scene of North Africa

A Meeting of Cultures is a pathbreaking work focused specifically on contemporary fashion designers and influencers in Morocco, Algeria, Tunisia, Libya and Egypt. Lavishly illustrated, it broadens the scope of scholarship on the fashion industry, which to date has focused mainly on American and European designers.

North Africa has always been a crossroads of cultures. To illuminate the myriad facets of the local fashion and fashion industry, this comprehensive publication showcases the works of contemporary fashion designers along with photography by fashion photographers, journalists and social media influencers. Organised around three themes, "Disruptors", "Our Land", and "Threads", the catalogue showcases fashion practitioners from across North Africa who work to retain cultural distinctiveness while adapting to contemporary concerns ranging from sustainability to gender identity.





### CARL GROSSBERG New Forms in the World of Technology

Carl Grossberg's (1894–1940) painting career was bracketed by the two world wars. He drew his subject matter from "the enormous wealth of new forms in the world of technology," recognising both its potential and its dangers. The publication examines the paintings, drawings and prints of the German New Objectivity painter in the Merrill C. Berman Collection.

Long associated with the German New Objectivity movement of the 1920s, Grossberg is revered for his precise paintings of industry, devoid of human figures but vibrant with colour. His "Dream Pictures" envision industrial settings inhabited by unexpected creatures, such as monkeys, bats and birds, which act to destabilise the certainty of such materialised rationalism. This lavishly illustrated book takes an unprecedented object-based approach and focuses on the reception of the works during the artist's lifetime. It highlights his Bauhaus training, his interrelated practices as a painter and interior designer, the centrality of commissions, and his relationship with the National Socialist regime after 1933. It is a robust study of Carl Grossberg's work and life with a full scholarly armature including historical photographs, documents and publications.



# Liberal, progressive and visionary: a network for abstract art!


### NETWORK PARIS abstraction-création 1931–1937

A journey to the art capital of the 1930s: Paris. The avant-garde group abstraction-création and its fifty or so members were an inspiration to the art world with their clear lines and kaleidoscopic experiments with form. Leading figures of abstraction joined together to support artistic freedom and oppose the rise of fascism, before modernism shifted its gravitational centre to New York.

Sophie Taeuber-Arp's distinctly concrete forms and Hans Arp's organic abstractions, Theo van Doesburg's compositions of line grids and Jean Gorin's social utopias transformed into abstract forms – the entire cosmos of non-representational art found a home in the cosmopolitan group abstraction-création. This visually superlative volume combines highlights of abstract art with carefully integrated contemporary perspectives, offering an introduction to the group, impressions of Paris in the 1930s and a visual treasure trove.



### POETRY OF LIGHT Richard Pousette-Dart

Alongside artists such as Jackson Pollock and Mark Rothko, Richard Pousette-Dart (1916–1992) was one of the most important pioneers of Abstract Expressionism. More than 130 outstanding works from all creative phases allow us to immerse ourselves in the colourful and multifaceted oeuvre of this remarkable artist.

The American avant-garde movement of Abstract Expressionism radically changed the course of modern painting. Like many of his fellow artists, Pousette-Dart was intensely preoccupied with themes such as myth, spirituality and the archaic. His light-flooded works often evoke ideas of transcendental force through motifs reminiscent of the firmament or the charged energy of celestial bodies. This opulent volume impressively presents Pousette-Dart's art as a poetry of light.



# Between reality and utopia – visions of a better world

### MAX PECHSTEIN Vision and Work

The Expressionist and "Brücke" artist Max
Pechstein was a pioneering representative of
modernism in Germany. His intensely colourful
depictions of people and nature are regarded as
foundational to Expressionism and were a defining
inspiration for an entire epoch. This publication
magnificently illustrates the diversity and depth
of his oeuvre.

Many of his paintings are regarded as icons of Expressionism, yet the stylistic breadth of Max Pechstein's art extends well beyond his works from the "Brücke" period. He found inspiration in his visits to what he called "painter's paradises" on the Baltic Sea and in the South Pacific, where his focus on the unity of man and nature crystallised. Pechstein's art and his yearning for harmony in an unstable world reflect our current and increasingly appreciative view of nature and the environment, and thus serve as a bridge to the present time.






# Diasporic creativity in American art

### EDWARD E. BOCCIA Painter of Nightmares and Dreams


Edward E. Boccia (1921–2012) is a widely collected yet often overlooked American artist whose compelling pictorial language reveals a vision of universal experience, love, loss and suffering as well as a deep connection to literature, mythology and the canons of art history. During his long career, Boccia developed a new genre of contemporary monumental panel painting that functioned as devotional art while raising questions about ethical, philosophical and stylistic problems in twentieth-century America.




# A celebration of forms and colours – the multifaceted work of the American Surrealist


### **SENGA NENGUDI Populated Air**

Radically expanding our understanding of Senga Nengudi's art, this book publishes drawings, prints, photographs, performance scores and poetry that have never been seen before, spanning five decades of her practice.







For fifty years, American artist Linda Lighton has created a powerful body of subversive ceramic sculptures that explore desire in all its complex forms. Her work uses wit and seduction as conceptual weaponry to mine the relationship between sex, power and politics.

# ABOUT GLASS Contemporary Sculpture and Installations

In its feel, plasticity, luminosity and narrative quality, glass is a material like no other, captivating us with its immediacy. Artists such as Monica Bonvicini, Erwin Eisch, Carlos Garaicoa, Mona Hatoum, Shirazeh Houshiary, Laure Prouvost, Kiki Smith and Ann Wolff have appreciated the unique physicality of glass, and were inspired to create magnificent works.






### Hot, lush and specific: David Katzenstein & the Duaflex camera

### DAVID KATZENSTEIN Brownie

Brownie is a collection of photographs created by photographer David Katzenstein over ten years from 1979–89. With this series Katzenstein pays homage to the famous line of Brownie cameras introduced in 1900. He used its successor, the Kodak Dualflex, which followed in 1947. The result is a colourful, personal and sensitive view of the world.

Described by one critic as "Hot, lush and specific", the series starts in New York City and travels the globe to explore both distant places and the use of the Kodak Duaflex camera, launched in 1947 as an upgrade to the iconic Kodak Brownie cameras. Throughout the project, Katzenstein's goal was to embrace the camera's limitations as a means of pushing the boundaries of composition, juxtaposing foreground and background while heightening the use of colour. The superbly designed and produced publication is rounded with an introduction by Richard Grosbard.



New York-based photographer **David Katzenstein** travels the world on his lifelong artistic journey as a visual chronicler of humanity. Using subject, light and composition to create visual dynamism, he invites viewers to be in the moment with him. Katzenstein is the managing editor of the Barkley L. Hendricks Photography Archive. To date, he has published three monographs: *Ritual* (2022), *Distant Journeys* (2024), and *Brownie* (2025).



### MARTA ASTFALCK-VIETZ Staging the Self

Experimenting with light and shadow, multiple exposures, surrealist imagery, and role-play – this is the artistic terrain of Marta Astfalck-Vietz (1901–1994). Her spellbinding photography from the 1920s stages bodies, interweaves pictorial planes, and exhibits dreamlike realities created through her own unique methods.

In her self-renderings Astfalck-Vietz presents us with fantastical illusions by way of technical innovation. She designed and tailored her own costumes, slipping into different characters, be it a common drinker or a society lady, naked or wrapped in lace. Through role-play she eludes the (male) gaze by consciously staging her own body. Inspired by a wide range of illustrated magazines, silent film classics from the 1920s and her fascination with nature, she created an impressive body of work which can now be discovered in its full range, extending even to watercolours with plant motifs.

# How did color come into photography? A revolution in visual culture


### TRUE COLORS Color in Photography from 1849 to 1955

The desire for colour in photography prevailed throughout the world of photography from the very beginning. What were the early techniques? And when did colour become accessible to everyone? This volume traces the exciting path from the medium's beginnings in the nineteenth century to widely used analogue colour photography starting with the first Kodak colour slide films in 1936.

Photography's various colouring processes opened up a radiant new cosmos. The Albertina's unique collection sheds light on the complex topic of historical colour photos. It ranges from early coloured one-offs to the emergence of mass-produced colour photographs on a positive-negative basis. The numerous techniques, many of them little-known, and the resulting diverse applications reveal a revolution across our entire visual culture.



### ARCHITECTURE AND ENERGY Building in the Time of Climate Change

The energy requirements of buildings are enormous, resulting in a significant proportion of global CO<sub>2</sub> emissions – both in the construction phase and during the building's use and eventual demolition. In an era of energy transition and extreme weather phenomena, the question "How do we build in a time of climate change?" becomes all the more urgent. This volume presents international best-practice projects characterised by sustainable design and provides forward-looking answers.

A sustainably built wood and concrete supermarket that includes a roof farm; a kindergarten constructed from locally sourced recycled materials; the renovation of an office building so that it can dispense with its air conditioning and ventilation systems: in addition to the choice of materials and innovative operating concepts, the possibilities for reducing emissions and energy requirements lie above all in thinking about the entire life cycle of a building, including refurbishing rather than new construction when possible. This volume brings together realworld examples and offers starting points for how to approach construction today and in the future.

# Multiple Visions: The folk art and toy collections of architect and designer Alexander Girard (1907–1993)


### When tradition meets global modernism – masterworks from Iran

### MODERN IRAN AND THE AVANT-GARDES 1948–78

Modern Iran and the Avant-Gardes explores how the complex cultural tensions of the nation's period between 1948 and 1978 led to artistic innovation.

As Iran modernised, modernism became distinctly Iranian. Iranian artists created a unique form of modernism that addressed the tension between commitments to innovate and an engagement with traditional Iranian ideas and cultural forms.

Lavishly illustrated, this publication features thirty artists who worked during the pivotal period between 1948 and 1978 and practised in a range of media from painting and sculpture to printmaking, drawing and architecture. Featuring an introductory essay by exhibition curator Pantea Haghighi that surveys the range of artistic and political influences on the emergence of Iranian modernisms and a selection of focused essays by scholars and curators Fereshteh Daftari, Davood Madadpoor, Hans Ulrich Obrist and Ali Bakhtiari, *Modern Iran and the Avant-Gardes, 1948–78* is a timely addition to the scholarship on both alternative modernisms and the history of Iranian art.



As an independent curator and doctoral student at Simon Fraser University in Vancouver, Pantea Haghighi focuses her research on modernism in architecture and the visual arts in relation to the politics of language. She is currently Curator in Residence at the Vancouver Art Gallery and Administrator/Curator at the West Vancouver Art Museum.






